

   He had previously created OpenFeint, a social platform for mobile games, which he sold to GREE, a Japanese company, for \$104 million in 2011.
- Stan Vishnevskiy's Background: Vishnevskiy also had a gaming background and shared Citron's vision of creating a better communication tool for gamers.

#### **Development and Launch**

- Citron's gaming company, Hammer & Chisel, initially worked on a game called Fates Forever, which was not very successful. However, during its development, Citron saw the need for a better voice chat system that would allow for seamless in-game communication. This need became the inspiration for Discord.
- Discord launched in 2015 with a strong focus on low latency and userfriendliness for gamers. It quickly caught on, thanks to its simplicity and reliability.

#### **Growth and Expansion**

- Early Adoption by Gamers: Discord spread among online gaming communities, especially in genres like first-person shooters (FPS) and massively multiplayer online games (MMOs), where voice communication was essential.
- Fundraising: Discord raised significant funding from venture capital firms. In 2020, it became a unicorn startup with a valuation exceeding \$1 billion.
- 3. Beyond Gaming: While Discord started as a gamer's platform, its features appealed to a wider audience. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Discord saw a surge in users from educational institutions, work-from-home setups, and other non-gaming communities.
- Rebranding: In 2020, Discord rebranded itself with the slogan "Your place to talk and hang out", reflecting its broadening user base beyond gaming.
